## Park Pavilions



McKean Recreation Authority continues to maintain three great pavilions available for summer parties and events. All pavilions are accessible to the elderly and persons with disabilities and equipped with electric and water close by.


Pavilion #3 offers a kitchen and serving area. The kitchen has a double-bowl stainless steel sink, hot and cold running water, commercial double door refrigerator, stainless steel tables and shelves, and plenty of electrical outlets for roasters.

Rental of pavilion #3 with the kitchen is \$225. Pavilion rental rates are \$125 per day. If you would like to make a reservation for any of the pavilions, please call 814-476-7414.

The park offers horseshoe pits, volleyball court, swing sets, and a children's jungle set. Restrooms are handicap accessible. We have a beautiful walking trail that is just over a mile in length. The park closes at sunset.

The Recreation Authority has recently had WiFi run to the area and security cameras installed throughout the entire range of the park.

Looking for Additions to Your Perennial Garden? The Perennial Plant Association has announced the 2024 Perennial Plant of the Year is Phlox Paniculata "Jeana." The plant of the year is not a new cultivar, but rather a plant that has been around long enough to have been tested and successfully grown in a large area of North America. Full Sun. Attracts Butterflies and Hummingbirds, Great Cut Flower, Fragrant, Native Cultivar, Grows 3-4'.

Another option is to add some native plants to your garden if possible. Planting even a few has been shown to benefit birds, butterflies and all of nature. Just google a native plant finder for our area and please check the PA Invasive Species list.



## From the Desk of Boro Council

Hello McKean Borough Residents and 2024! Time for an update on the progress the Boro has made in 2023, and what you can expect in this new year. In 2023 East Ave. had a surface re-paving, and the streetlights were switched to much brighter LED's. The delineators and new signs were installed with new bright lines painted to mark the one-way traffic direction coming off Rt. 99, and also turning onto Rt. 99 from N. Main. Hopefully residents have noticed a slower pace and safer traffic pattern with the upgrades. Again, Council would ask everyone to please slow down on our Borough streets, residents have notified Council that many automobiles do not pay attention to the speed limits on any of the Borough Streets, and the increased speed of traffic is a safety concern for all.

Once again, we have to remind everyone of the responsibility of each homeowner to keep their sidewalks clean. Boro code requires walkways to be cleared by homeowners. A new Nuisance Ordinance was passed by Council and will be enforced if any violations occur. A copy of the Ordinance No. I-2023 pertaining to nuisances can be found on www.mckeanborough.com. We continue to have multiple complaints during the winter months of snowy sidewalks, including at the McKean Elementary School. There have been discussions to change the ordinance requiring homeowners to keep their sidewalks clear, and hire a service to maintain the Borough sidewalks. That would most likely trigger a tax increase, which have not been raised in over 30 years. Council would like to hear from residents if this would be an acceptable solution to the continued disregard of the homeowner's responsibility to keep their walkways clear.

There was a municipal election held in 2023. Eric Morgan, Dodi Oblinski and Joe Cimino were elected to Borough Council. Congratulations to the new Council member Joe Cimino, he is looking forward to working for the residents of McKean Borough.

A great big THANK YOU to Beth Laughlin and her husband Jerry! They were the driving force behind acquiring the Snowflakes on Main St and the triangle. The Laughlins have put the snowflake lights up, taken them down, maintained and stored them for the past 17 years. If you see Beth or Jerry, please thank them. We want to send an equally huge THANK YOU to the guys at McKean Township who have helped put up and take down the snowflakes for the last couple of years and have offered to continue to do so for our community. The Township bucket truck makes the job so much easier and faster than the ladder process the Laughlins had to use.

The 2024 County/Township tax bill will be mailed around March 1, 2024. This covers the year of January 1 through December 31, 2024. Tax bills are sent to the address provided by the parcel owner to Erie County Assessment. If you have had a mailing address change recently, please contact me or Erie County Assessment at 814-451-6225 to change your mailing address. Otherwise, the bill will be mailed to the address they have on file. If you do not receive your tax bill by March 15<sup>th</sup>, please contact me. Mills for the bill remain the same as last year. Discount period remains the same and ends April 30, 2024.

Any unpaid 2023 taxes were turned over to Erie County Tax Claim as delinquent. Payments for the 2023 County/Township and 2023 General McLane School taxes can no longer be paid at this office. Contact Erie County Tax Claim at 814-451-6206 for instructions. If you need a receipt for any taxes paid in 2023, please contact me either by phone, email at the address listed below or send a S.A.S.E. and your request through USPS or deposit in the lockbox located outside of my door.




#### LOOKING BACK AT 2023, LOOKING FORWARD TO 2024

The start to every new year comes with a bit of reflection on the year that's just ended as well as thoughts of what could be accomplished in the coming year. That can be even more pronounced for an elected law-maker.

For me, looking back at 2023, I was honored to have been chosen to be part of the Pennsylvania Senate Republican Caucus leadership team as the chairman of my caucus's policy committee. The Senate Majority Policy Committee often serves as a staging ground where legislative ideas can be dissected, critiqued and improved. I have traveled the state with the committee, holding hearings and gathering public input on policy issues important to the prosperity of our commonwealth.

Those hearings have touched on such issues as energy access and affordability; the Sterling Act and its impact on Philadelphia's surrounding communities; land use regulations and housing affordability; rural workforce challenges; criminal justice statistics and trends in Pennsylvania; innovation and emerging technology within our state; and the impacts of Pennsylvania government rules and ways to streamline, improve or eliminate irrelevant regulations as they relate to the effects they have on individual lives and the economy.



A hearing about housing affordability found that to make homeownership more affordable for many Pennsylvanians, zoning ordinances should be used to allow a mix of housing options, more units per acre and greater opportunity for manufactured housing.

Another of our committee hearings found that in addition to housing affordability, our state's rural communities are struggling with declining population, few childcare options and limited mass transit, all which impede economic development and quality of life improvement in these communities. We learned some private institutions and public entities are trying to help rural communities overcome these challenges with expanded educational opportunities and partnerships between employers and schools.

Crime has been a top concern nationally, and it's no different throughout Pennsylvania. During a hearing with prosecutors, law enforcement and crime statistics collectors, we learned many crimes are driven by poor mental health and a lack of resources to address those issues, particularly when dealing with juvenile offenders, who also suffer from a lack of role models. The testimony indicated employment and available mental health services are key to addressing these issues, as well as criminal recidivism in all age groups.

We also looked at technological innovation within our commonwealth, identifying the substantial role innovative life science and technological companies play in Pennsylvania's economy. Testimony suggested public funding and lower taxes as ways to support the continued growth of these companies.

The most recent committee hearing tackled ways to address unnecessary regulations, inefficient permitting and other government red tape that increase our poverty rate, create unemployment and negatively impact projects, all affecting our commonwealth's ongoing competitiveness. The hearing made clear we need to strike a better balance between the need to protect the public and to create a business-friendly environment that fosters entrepreneurship, job creation and prosperity.

2024 will bring more hearings, with the next one focusing on human trafficking.

Looking forward to the coming year, one of my top goals remains securing a City Revitalization and Improvement Zone (CRIZ) for Erie. A CRIZ will provide a boost to economic development and job creation in the city and region. All state and local taxes collected within the CRIZ would be used to repay debt service for efforts undertaken to stimulate economic development projects within the CRIZ.

This will spur new growth and help revive the city. We can take vacant, desolate, underutilized or abandoned space and develop it for new uses. That in turn will create new jobs and attract new employers and residents, as well as visitors, to the city and the region.

I remain committed to doing whatever is in my power to see that Erie receives the jumpstart it deserves so we can all enjoy the benefits a CRIZ could bring to our city through job creation and economic development.

2023 was a very productive year for me and the policy committee, and 2024 has the potential to be a very big year as well. I look forward to continuing to work for the benefit of all our state's residents by protecting our jobs, empowering our families and defending the freedoms we all enjoy in our commonwealth.

Parish Center. All these community services are being directed by senior patrol leaders Elijah Hart and Ethan Snyder.



First and foremost we would like to let the community know that we have been busy developing our paid service. This new entity is called Middleboro Fire and Rescue. We currently have 5 employees, two being full time and three part-time. We are always looking for, and accepting volunteers, but due to decreasing availability of our members we have started the paid service.

A picture has been added of one of our part time employees wearing their new polo when you see

them out in the community. Our call volume continues to rise so we are considering adding to our paid staff with the help of both the township and borough. Other updates include continuing training with some new devices acquired from a grant. We now have a Lucas Device on the ambulance. This device delivers chest compressions to a patient, allowing first responders to address other life saving measures at the same time. We are also required to continue training on various department of health updates and will do so this year. Another exciting update is McKean Hose Co working collaboratively with our mutual aid departments. We have started monthly joint drill nights taking turns hosting and developing both EMS and Fire training for our members. We have also been helping each other out on emergency calls so you may end up seeing a member from Edinboro on a call for McKean.



Lastly, we are planning on moving our annual gun raffle to earlier in the fall, or end of summer this year. This is the only fundraiser we have planned so far but any updates will be posted on our Facebook page. Hoping everyone has a wonderful new year!

### RESIDENTIAL REAL ESTATE TAX EXEMPTION

Due to interest in our real estate tax exemption program, we have decided to extend the tax exemptions for new residential construction of single-family dwellings to December 31, 2026. This exemption from taxes is 100% for a period of three years. This means all real estate taxes...... township, county, and school taxes. There were five (5) families who will be taking advantage of this worthwhile tax exemption in 2023 with hopefully many more for the year 2024....



### 2024 DOG LICENSES......



.....are available at the township office from 8 a.m. – 3 p.m., Monday through Friday. All dogs three months and older are required to be licensed. The price for a regular license is \$8.70. This is an increase from last year with no discounts being offered for spay or neutered dogs. Discounts are available for qualifying senior citizens ore persons with disabilities. If you see a stray or nuisance dog, call the animal enforcement officer Brian Froess (814) 796-4678.

#### ROADS AND BRIDGES

We continue to keep the roads and bridges throughout our community at the highest possible standard thanks to Brian, Ron, Jeff B., Jeffrey G., and Jarred.!!

SNOW AND ICE REMOVAL.....It is unlawful to park any motor vehicle or other vehicle on any roadway in the township following the deposit or accumulation of ice or snow until the snow has been completely plowed.......Also, it is unlawful to deposit snow or ice upon any public roadway.

If there is a problem with ditches or potholes in the spring, please call our office at 476-7414. All Township paved roads will be posted with a 10-ton weight limit until May 15, 2024. Observing the weight limitation on these roads through the early spring months will help avoid costly road repairs.

We are hoping to begin construction of the three bridges on Old 99 sometime in late 2024 or 2025. These bridges will be replaced at no cost to McKean Township due to monies from the \$5 Local Use Fee on car registrations with PADOT sharing in the total costs of the project.



The above roads are just our wish list......depending on how the rest of our roads weathered the harsh winter and thawing spring.

The Supervisors realize that residents want to protect their yards during the winter months by installing lawn markers along the road berm. Some of these lawn markers are of the type that could cause harm or injury, especially metal markers. Please be advised that under the PA Second Class Township Code, it is unlawful to obstruct or commit any nuisance within the township's road right of way.

#### COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT PROGRAM

We are preparing to make application for our 2024 CDBG grant allocation which is administered through the Erie County Department of Planning. The majority of our projects have been to rehabilitate owner-occupied single-family dwellings. ### **ZONING**

The Township receives many telephone calls annually about general nuisances: i.e. burning, excessive noise, barking dogs, unkempt lawns, etc. The Township does not have burning or noise ordinances and we do not have property maintenance codes. We believe that our residents have enough courtesy for their neighbors to approach the neighbor respectfully about the nuisance. We do not believe in creating laws that would apply to the entire population of the Township just because a few may be unreasonable. We do not want to be an "all-controlling" government.

Please use common sense about burning – don't let your fire smolder for hours, especially on hot days when everyone has their windows open; don't burn offensive materials-recycle or put them out for the garbage.

You may have a legitimate complaint that can be handled with a phone call, however the proper way to submit a complaint is IN WRITING. You can find our complaint form online at our website. Anonymous complaints will not be addressed; but be assured that we will not reveal your name or address when following up on problems. That information remains confidential. If legal action is required; then you may be asked to testify on the behalf of the municipality.

Talking to your neighbor is ultimately the best way to resolve problems. Respect for each other will develop when you know each other and are able to talk. It makes life a lot easier when you are able to smile and wave at your neighbor instead of being annoyed.

#### MCKEAN TOWNSHIP AWARDED GRANT MONEY

In September 2020, McKean Township was awarded a \$415,000 grant from the Commonwealth Financing Authority for the replacement of the Colonial Village Sewage Treatment Plant. This grant will provide our aging plant the necessary funds needed for replacement. The grant will cover 85% of the total cost of the project with 15% to be matched by the township. On October of last year, we have also received an additional grant in the amount of \$250,000 from Erie County which we hope will eliminate the need to raise sewer rates in the Colonial Village Subdivision. Construction of the new plant is anticipated to begin as soon as this summer.

### PEFFER ROAD TRAIL PROJECT

We are happy to announce that the trail and pavilion off Peffer Road are completed. This is a .23-mile trail to Elk Creek with ADA parking and picnic area. We are hoping to encourage four-season outdoor recreation by residents, visits by groups interested in nature-based education and new opportunities for outdoor recreational user groups from outside our community.
